Apple iBook Use and Handling

General Handling

The iBook is fun to use and a great tool for school, but it is not a toy. Remember it is still a computer and, as such, it must be handled with care. There are several things you can do to make you iBook last longer and offer you a trouble-free and rewarding experience.

It is portable and you can take it everywhere.

One of the best features of your iBook is the fact that it is portable. It enables you to take your homework and information wherever you go. When transporting your iBook, there are a few simple things you can do to protect it.

- When you put your iBook in your carrying case, remember it is there. Don't throw the carrying case on the floor, use it as a backrest on the bus, cram it in your locker, etc.
- Place it in its protective sleeve when you're not using it. It is especially important that your iBook be in the protective sleeve whenever you're moving it from one location to another.
- Keep your iBook dry and protect it from rain and snow.
- · Do not eat or drink near where you are using your iBook.
- Close the lid of your iBook before carrying it from one location to another. This ensures all

3.Q:Can I load my own software?

A:To avoid system problems and licensing conflicts, students will not be able to load software on their computers.

4.Q:What if students download software, anyway?

A:Even if software is downloaded onto the machine, student iBooks are configured to prevent installation.

5.Q:What if I my kid has her own computer and we don't want to use the school's?

A:Working around incompatibilities of software and hardware can consume time that would otherwise be spent on teaching and learning, all students need to use computers provided by the school.

6.Q:How will the school provide tech support?

A:Help stations will be available to students in three areas: the Enterprise Zone, the E.T. IMC, and the Media Center.

7.Q:Who should I call if I have questions about my kid's computer?

A:You should first contact your child's homeroom advisor, who can either answer your question, find the answer, or direct you to the appropriate person.

8.Q: Can other members of the student's family use the computer?

A: Yes, but not for extended periods. If an immediate family member wants to use it when the student isn't working on it, that's fine.

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OK: Mom wants to check email. Brother wants to write a paper. Dad wants to check scores on the internet.

Not OK:Mom takes it to work. Brother takes it to middle school for presentation. Dad takes it with him on business trip. Never OK:Use by anyone outside the student's immediate family.

A: Yes, as long as you're sure that you can keep it in a safe and secure location at all times.


A:After students and their parents have picked up their computers, they may wish to talk with vendors stationed in the Little Theater (Room 271) who are prepared to

Acceptable Use Responsibilities Agreements

Any person who is accessing the Internet using school equipment and services understands and agrees to the following. Use of the Internet is monitored, both by adult supervisors, and by random technical devices.

Not accepting these responsibilities, or any infraction which shows non-compliance, would lead to restrictions or severance of access to services, as well as other possible disciplinary actions.

- Users shall have obtained necessary instruction in the use of the Internet before attempting to use it.
- Accessing sites that are violently or sexually explicit and/or blatantly offensive in content is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Use the Internet only to obtain information related to an academic project or school assignment. (This may include student exploration activities based on learning objectives or exploration activities by staff or by other adults after school hours.)
- 4. Do not use the Internet for extended periods of time when others may be waiting to have access or when the network may be heavily used. Searches which are expected to take an extended period of time should be scheduled with teachers or other adult monitors.

15.Q:What will the school do if I refuse to check out a laptop for my kid?

A:Because the iBook will be an integral part of the curriculum, the expectation is that every student will have a computer.

If 16.Q:I'm not going to sign this form. Now what?

A:Withhold computer and direct parent to the main office.
